Tha Colaisde a' Chaisteil air ceann oidhirpean airson cànan, eòlas cumhachd agus cliù ann an rannsachadh ann an Alba a leasachadh 's a bhrosnachadh, thuirt Fiona Hyslop, Rùnaire a' Chaibineit airson Foghlaim agus Ionnsachaидh Fhad-beatha, an-diugh.

Bha Rùnaire a' Chaibineit a' tadhal air a' cholaiste airson coinneachadh ri oilleanaich Gàidhlig a tha ag ionnsachadh aig sgoil-shamhraidh Ghàidhlig na colaiste. Tha a' cholaiste air an t-slige a sheòladh gu dòigh-theagaisg bhogaidh ùr – an dòigh ÙLPAN – 'agus 's ann a tha i gu math soirbheachail.

Ghabh Rùnaire a' Chaibineit an cothrom airson Obair-lann Cumhachd Ath-nuadhachail na colaiste fhaicinn agus cuideachd an Obair-lann àraid Rannsachadh Cumhachd Samhla-sùla agus Samhlachaidh aig Greenspace.

Tha Obair-lann Cumhachd Ath-nuadhachail a' cumail taic ri siostam mion-chlèith na colaiste fhèin agus ri innleachdan pumpa-teas, grèine agus gaoithe – a' solar goireas sgrùdaidh a tha a' tarraing oilleanaich bho oilthighean eile air feadh na h-Alba. Tha sgoil-shamhraidh Ghàidhlig Colaisde a' Chaisteil na dearbh sheòrsa goireis a dh'fheumas sinn airson ginealaich ùr de luchd-labhairt Gàidhlig a bhrosnachadh.

EDUCATION SECRETARY VISITS LEWS CASTLE COLLEGE

Lewis Castle College is at the forefront of efforts to promote and develop Scotland's language, energy expertise and reputation for research Cabinet Secretary for Education and Lifelong Learning, Fiona Hyslop, said today.

The Cabinet Secretary was visiting the college to meet Gaelic language students studying at the college's Gaelic summer school. The College has pioneered a new immersion method of teaching – the ULPAN method – which is proving very successful.

The Cabinet Secretary also took the opportunity to tour the college's Renewable Energy Laboratory and the unique Greenspace Research Energy Visualisation and Simulation Laboratory.

The Renewable Energy Laboratory is supporting the college's own mini-grid system and wind, solar and heat pump devices – providing a study tool that attracts students from other universities across Scotland. Meanwhile the Research Energy Visualisation and Simulation Laboratory is helping to further develop Scotland's research and educational links – by providing computational research support and remote collaboration for developments.

The Cabinet Secretary said:

"With 60,000 Gaelic speakers in Scotland - including almost 6,000 in Glasgow - Gaelic really is a truly national language. However, in recent years it has not enjoyed the growth and vigour that it should. Lewis Castle College's Gaelic summer school is exactly the sort of resource we need to help inspire a new generation of Gaelic speakers.

"Yesterday I was pleased to announce the Scottish Government's plans to reinvigorate the learning and use of Gaelic language in Scotland. Lewis Castle College's clear commitment to Gaelic language, and to the heritage and culture of the islands, are a welcome contribution to that effort and will help promote Scotland's unique assets and allow them to thrive in the future.

"Among the other unique advantages that Scotland enjoys are our expertise and ambition in renewable energy. Again Lewis Castle College has positioned itself at the forefront of our drive to capitalise on our assets.
