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OGE A' CUR COMHAIRLE RI PLANA GÀIDHLIG

13 An Lùnastal 2009

Chuir OGE, oilthigh na Gàidhealtachd 's nan Eilean a tha san amharc, co-chomhairle phoblach fad sia seachdainean air bhog an-diugh air a phlana Gàidhlig air a mholadh.

Bidh am plana, na chiad air a dhèanamh le institiud àrd-fhoghlaim an Alba, a' coimhead ri dòighean anns as urrainn do OGE teagasg sa Ghàidhlig aig ìre oilthigh a bhrosnachadh agus a libhrigeadh air feadh na sgìre.

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UHI TO CONSULT ON GAELIC PLAN

UHI has launched a six week long public consultation today to hear views on its proposed Gaelic language plan as part of its drive to support and develop Gaelic across its college network.

The plan, the first produced by a higher education institution in Scotland, looks at the ways in which UHI can promote and deliver university-level teaching in Gaelic across the region.

The consultation process will include bilingual public meetings held via video conference from locations across the network. Chaired by a panel of prominent figures from the Gaelic speaking community as well as key members of the UHI staff, the meeting will be an opportunity for comments to be made about the plan and its implementation.

Anna Walker, Gaelic Development Officer at UHI, said: "Producing this plan demonstrates UHI's commitment towards the Gaelic language and as a place of bilingual learning. We look forward to hearing views from as many people as possible as to how they feel the plan will achieve this and what we can do to improve it."

Bob Cormack, Principal of UHI, said: "Consultation on the Gaelic Plan is an important step for UHI and will help us fulfil the central role we play in supporting and developing Gaelic-medium learning as the prospective university of the Highlands and Islands."

I would encourage anybody with an interest in the language plan, be they a past student or simply somebody who enjoys speaking Gaelic, to come along and share their views."
