LOCAL BUSINESSES TO EXPLORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR GAELIC

Businesses will later this week have the chance to win up to £1,000 towards bilingual marketing and advertising when Inverness hosts a seminar on Gaelic and business.

The seminar, 'Gaelic - an economic opportunity for the Highlands and Islands', will be held on Friday March 20 and will host businesses such as the Glen Coe Ski Centre, Highland Airways and Crown Vets (in Inverness) on how Gaelic has helped their business through its use on company signs, websites, marketing, and amongst staff.

The day is free to attend and will be chaired by BBC broadcaster Mark Stephen and discussions will be conducted through English. The seminar will also include sessions on the Gaelic labour market, and on how businesses can access assistance on using Gaelic in their business.

Businesses attending the event will have the opportunity to win up to £1,000 towards marketing and advertising which uses Gaelic.

Eairdsidh MacLean of Comunn na Gàidhlig, who are staging the event, encouraged businesses to come along to the event and find out more, "We are delighted to have this opportunity to engage with the business community and to be able to promote the benefits of using the language in business.
