# BÒRD NA GÀIDHLIG A' COMHARRACHADH DÒMHNALL MEEK MAR SHÀR GHÀIDHEAL

22 An Cèitean 2009

Chaidh an obair a rinneadh le fear de shàr sgoilearan agus foghlamaichean saoghal na Gàidhlig a chomharrachadh le Bòrd na Gàidhlig, a th' air urram ùr – Sàr Ghàidheal – a bhualeachadh air an Àrd-Ollamh Dòmhnnall Meek a bhuineas do Thiriodh. Tha e cuideachd air urram fhaighinn bho Chomhairle nan Ealain a th' air ainv a cheangal ri duais ùr do sgrìobhadairean Gàidhlig.

Tha urram an t-Sàr Ghàidheil air a bhualeachadh an seo airson a' chiad uair, duais a tha ag aithneachadh gniomhan ionmholta às leth na Gàidhlig agus bidh "Duais Dhòmhnaill Meek" a' cumail taic ri innleachdan eile a tha am measg dhòighean air litreachas na Gàidhlig a chumail suas agus a bhrosnachadh.

Tha Dòmhnnall Meek fhathast an sàs ann an dà chomataidh foghlaim aig Bòrd na Gàidhlig an deidh a dhreuchd mar Àrd-Ollamh Gàidhlig agus Gnothaichean Albannach ann an Oïlthigh Dhùn Èideann a leigeil dheth aig deireadh 2008.

Chaidh a chuid sgoilearachd is eile a chomharrachadh roimhe seo le Oïlthigh Obair Dheathain a dh'fhoillsich iris shònraichte de Scottish Gaelic Studies (Caindel Alban : fèill-sgrìobhainn do Dhòmhnnall E Meek) anns an robh 600 duilleag de sgrìobhaidhean is eile bho eòlaichean agus co-oibricean a bh' air a bhith an sàs ann an cùisean còmhla ris thar nam bliadhnaichean.

Chruinnich grunn de charaidean is eòlaichean Dhòmhnaill gu cuirm an Glaschu a-raoir (Diardaoin 21 Cèitean) air aoigheachd Bhòrd na Gàidhlig gu lonad na Piobaireachd a chomharrachadh cuid de na gnothaichean eile anns an robh e an sàs. Chaidh duais an t-Sàr Ghàidheil a thoirt seachad le Anna NicSuain, Iar-Neach-Cathrach a' Bhùird. Chaidh port ùr – Professor Donald Meek of Tiree - a chaidh a sgrìobhadh leis an neach chiùil ainmeil à Tiriodh Aonghas MacPhàil cuideachd a thoirt dha.

Thuirt Rosemary Nic a' Bhàird, Ceannard an Gniomh Bhòrd na Gàidhlig: "Tha Dòmhnnall Meek air a bhith na dheagh charaid agus na ghaisgeach do shaoghal na Gàidhlig agus tha e air a bhith na bhall cudromach de dh'iomadach iomairt is gluasad thar nam bliadhnaichean, agus fhathast an sàs ann an iomadh cùis a tha a' fuasgladh romhainn. air Buidheann Comhairleachaidh an Riaghaltais (MAGOG) ann an 2001-2 fior chudromach agus 's e sin a thug dhuinn ri ùine Bòrd na Gàidhlig ann an 2003. Tha Dòmhnull air a bhith a' cur gu mòr ri leasachadh na Gàidhlig fad bhliadhnaichean agus gu sònraichte ann an raon an fhoghlaim. Tha a chliù air aithneachadh fad is farsainn agus bidh buaidh aig a chuid gniomha fad bhliadhnaichean air thoiseach. Tha sinn air leth toilichte gu bheil e deònach a cheangalan a chumail le Bòrd na Gàidhlig agus gum bi buaidh aige fhathast air na tha sinn a' dùanamh agus tro ghliocas agus a chuid comhairle is fialaidheachd gun tèid againn air ar rùintean airson seasmhachd na Gàidhlig a dhaingneachadh. Tha sinn a' guidhe gach soirbheachadh is sonas do Dhòmhnull agus Rachel nan saoghal ùr anns an Eaglais Bhreac agus an Tiriodh agus a-mach bho sin, agus an dòchas gum bi a chuid gniomha a' togail bhàtaichean a-nis agus na eachdraiche air saoghal na mara a cheart cho luachmhor agus toileach dha fhèin 's a bha saoghal na sgoilearachd."

Tha Comhairle nan Ealain agus Bòrd na Gàidhlig a-nis air tighinn còmhla a chur air adhart duais ùr do sgrìobhaichean - Duais Dhòmhnaill Meek (the Donald Meek Literary Award) a bhios ag amas air sgrìobhaidhean sgoilearan òga. Thèid an duais a fhrithealadh le Comhairle nan Leabhraichean, agus thèid barrachd fiosrachaiddh a sgaoileadh mun seo ann an ùine nach bi fada. Thuirt an t-Ollamh Gavin Wallace, Ceannard Litreachais aig SAC: "'S e duais air leth cudromach a tha seo a tha a' comharrachadh an dlùth-cheangal a bha eadar Dòmhnull agus Comhairle nan Leabhraichean, agus bidh e na chuideachadh mòr ann a bhith a' cumail taic ri sgrìobhadh Gàidhlig anns na bliadhnaichean romhainn. Dh'fhaodadh e sgilean aithneachadh ann an sgrìobhadairean ùra, a bhith a' comharrachadh ghnìomhan a rinneadh le sgrìobhaiche a th' air a bhith ag obair airson greis, no neach-measaidh, no gu dearbh na dhuais do sgoilear a tha ùr-nochdadadh no mar chomharradh air gniomhan sgoilearachd a tha aire air sin.'"

### BÒRD NA GÀIDHLIG AND SCOTTISH ARTS COUNCIL HONOUR DONALD MEEK AND LAUNCH LITERARY AWARD

**22 May 2009**

The work of one of Gaeldom's greatest scholars and educationalists Professor Donald Meek has been recognised by Bòrd na Gàidhlig, the principal public agency responsible for developing Gaelic, and the Scottish Arts Council. Professor Meek is the first recipient of Bòrd na Gàidhlig's "Sàr Ghàidheal" award for outstanding contributions to the language and "Duais Dhòmhnaill Meek" (The Donald Meek Literary Award) will be a significant addition to the support structures being offered to Gaelic writers.

Professor Meek, who continues to contribute to Gaelic development through work on two of Bòrd na Gàidhlig's education committees, formally retired from his post as Professor of Scottish and Gaelic Studies at Edinburgh University at the end of 2008.

His distinguished contribution to Gaelic scholarship was recently marked by Aberdeen University which published a 600 page special issue of the journal Scottish Gaelic Studies containing articles by friends and scholars (Caindel Alban : fèill-sgrìobhainn do Dhòmhnaill E Meek) as a tribute to his wider academic achievements.

Bòrd na Gàidhlig invited a number of Professor Meek's friends and colleagues to jointly mark his outstanding contribution to Gaelic at a dinner in the Piping Centre in Glasgow last night (Thursday, May 21). He was presented with his Sàr Ghàidheal award by Annie MacSween, Vice-Chair of the Bòrd. He was also presented with a specially composed musical score "Professor Donald Meek of Tiree" penned by Tiree musician Angus MacPhail.

Rosemary Ward, Acting Chief Executive of Bòrd na Gàidhlig said: "Donald Meek has been a great friend and champion of all things Gaelic and has played a crucial role in many of the Gaelic developments which have come to fruition in recent years and others which are still unfolding. His work on the Ministerial Advisory Group for Gaelic (MAGOG) for the Scottish Executive in 2001-2 eventually led to the establishment of Bòrd na Gàidhlig in 2003. Donald has contributed to a wide range of Gaelic development and particularly in the fields of education over many years. His reputation goes before him and his heroic efforts will undoubtedly leave their mark on Gaelic for generations to come. I am delighted that he has continued to maintain his connections with Bòrd na Gàidhlig and that we will be able to benefit from his wisdom and generosity as we strive to achieve a sustainable future for Gaelic. We wish Donald and his wife Rachel a very happy retirement in Falkirk, Tiree and

beyond and hope that his long-cherished skills as a boat-builder and maritime historian will lead to significant other opportunities which will be just as fulfilling.”

The Scottish Arts Council has jointly with Bòrd na Gàidhlig established a new writers award (Duais Dhòmhnaill Meek, the Donald Meek Literary Award) which will be aimed at young writers and scholars. It will be offered under the auspices of Comhairle nan Leabhrachaean, the Gaelic Books Council, and further details will be made available shortly. Dr Gavin Wallace, Head of Literature at the Scottish Arts Council said: “This is a significant award to mark Donald’s association with the Books Council which will help support the future success Gaelic writing. It could recognise an outstanding new literary talent, the contribution made by an already established writer or critic, or for significant work of scholarship by an emergent or established academic specialist.”
