FINAL PREPARATIONS UNDERWAY FOR BT ALBA DEBATE 2010

29 October 2010

Final preparations are taking place ahead of the 2010 BT Scotland National Schools Gaelic Debate. The first two rounds will be held in An Lanntair in Stornoway next week, Tuesday and Wednesday the 2nd and 3rd of November 2010. The annual event will bring together twenty debating teams from sixteen schools from across Scotland who will all compete in this prestigious competition which has been running for over a decade. Competing for the first time are Wallace High School from Stirling, Inverness Royal Academy and Tiree High School. The final four schools will compete in the semi-finals which will be held in the Scottish Storytelling Centre in Edinburgh on Tuesday 23rd of November 2010. The Final of the BT Alba Debate will once again be held in the Scottish Parliament at Holyrood on Wednesday the 24th of November 2010 and will be broadcast live on BBC Radio nan Gàidheal from 6.00pm that evening. The ten winning teams from Round One, along with the two other teams deemed worthy of a place in the next round by the adjudicators will all debate the same topic in the second round. The four teams with the highest points will progress to the semi-finals in Edinburgh. The draw for Round 1 is as follows:
