Bòrd na Gàidhlig a' sireadh Ceannard

Tha Bòrd na Gàidhlig a' sireadh Ceannard airson na buidhne a stiùireadh agus Plana Nàiseanta na Gàidhlig a chur an gnìomh. Tha sanasan a' nochdadh ann am pàipearan naidheachd is eile bhon diugh (Diardaoin, Màrt 25) agus tha tuilleadh fiosrachaидh ri fhaighinn air làrach-lìn a' Bhùird.

Tha dreuchd a' Cheannaird air a bhith bàn bho Lùnastal 2008 agus am Bòrd a' coimhead ri dòighean-obrach ùra agus a' fastadh luchd-obrach ann an diofar dhreuchdan eile.

Tha an obair ga shanasachd aig tuarastal £64k gu £73k agus tha am Bòrd an dòchas neach fhastadh son na dreuchd cho luath sa ghabhas.

Bòrd na Gàidhlig on trail of new Ceannard

Bòrd na Gàidhlig, the principal public body in Scotland promoting and developing Gaelic, has begun the search for a new Ceannard (CEO). Adverts are appearing in the local and national media from today (Thursday, March 25) and further information, including background packs for potential candidates, is available on the Bòrd na Gàidhlig website.

The Ceannard's post has been vacant since August 2008 and the duties involved in managing the Bòrd have been undertaken since the summer of 2009 by an Interim Support Management Team comprising Donald Martin, Jo MacDonald and Hugh Dan MacLennan.

The post is being advertised at a salary range of £64 to £73k and the Bòrd hopes to hold interviews in May with an appointment to be made as soon as possible. The closing date for applications is Friday, April 23.

Donald Martin, the Bòrd's Accountable Officer said: "The duties of the previous Ceannard were eventually taken on by the Interim Support Management Team while the Bòrd completed a process of restructuring to meet the challenges ahead for the development of Gaelic and in particular the demands of trying to increase the number of Gaelic speakers, its visibility and presence in Scottish life. Virtually all of the posts within the new structure have now been filled and it is time to find an individual who will propel the organisation onwards to the next level and be a dynamic champion for the language and its community, representing all the other Gaelic organisation's specific interests. This is arguably the single most important post in Gaelic and while it is clearly challenging and demanding in many ways, it will also be rewarding and satisfying for the successful applicant. The Bòrd is looking for someone with consummate communications skills who can lead the organisation, galvanising the Gaelic organisations' collective effort and become an inspiration for the wider Gaelic community. We will endeavour to find someone with a proven record who has worked in a range of fields and enterprises, with the confidence and ability to represent Gaelic's interests in all areas of public life and the home, and at all levels required ensuring its future sustainability and growth."
