## MINISTEAR AN RIAGHALTAIS A' CUR FÀILTE AIR A' CHIAD PLANA GÀIDHLIG ANN AN CRAOLADH

### 13 An t-Ògmhios 2011

‘S e tè de phrìomh chompanaidhean telebhisein na dùthcha, mneTV, a tha a’ lìbhrigeadh phrògraman spòrs leithid ball-coise bhon SPL, rugbaidh bho Lìog Mhagners, Ceòl Dùthchail, Dannsa agus agallamhan le rionnagan mòra saoghal nan ealan is cur-seachad, a’ chiad bhuidheann bho shaoghal craolaidh a th’air Plana Gàidhlig a dheisearachadh agus aontachadh le Bòrd na Gàidhlig. Mar chompanaidh phribheadach, chan eil mneTV air a meas mar “bhuidheann poblach” fo Achd na Gàidhlig agus air sgàth sin a’ tighinn fo impidh far a feumar leithid de Phlana a dhealbh. ‘S e a’ chompanaidh fhèin a għluais gus plana a dheasachadh mar mheadhan air ceumanan a għabha il-slige a chruthachadh gu Dealbhadh Gàidhlig ponngail agus seasmhach a chur an gniomh, agus chaidh am plana a chur air adhart chun Bhùird airson aonta. Tha dlùth cheangal gu math làidir air a bhith eadar mneTV, a chaidh a stèidheachadh ann am Beinn na Faoghla ann an 1989 agus a tha le priomh ofisean aig Cidhe a’ Chuain Sèimh ann an Glaschu, agus coimhearsnachdan na Gàidhlig tro chraoladh is prògraman telebhisein. Chuir am Ministear airson Sgilean agus Ionnsachadh Alasdair Allan BPA fàilte air Plana Gàidhlig mneTV. Thuir e: “Tha mi ro-thoilichte mneTV fhaicinn a’ gabhaile leithid de cheum seo air an ceann fhèin, agus iad mar chiad chompanaidh pribheadach a’ deisearachadh agus a’ foillseachadh Plana Gàidhlig. Leis a’ chompanaidh a’ sior chruthachadh stuth ann an Gàidhlig dhaibh fhèin gu làitheil, a bharrachd air a bhith a’ cur stuth a-mach agus air-loidhne, ‘s e ceum gu math cudromach a th’ann agus a’ leantainn rùintean Achd na Gàidhlig (Alba). Tha fiugħar agam tuilleadh chompanaidhean fhaicinn a’ leantainn an deagh eisimpleir agus a’ gabhaile leithid chionta de cheumanan.” Thuir Ailean Dòmhnullach, Àrd-Stiùiriche mneTV: “Ann an saoghal mòr nam meadhanan a tha a’ sior atharrachadh, tha sinne a’ creidsinn gu mòr gum bu chòir rùintean agus miann coimhearsnachd na Gàidhlig aithneachadh taobh-staigh ar Plana Gàidhlig. ‘S e ceum gu math nàdarra a bh’ann dhuinn a bhith an coluadar gu fairmeil leis a’ Bhòrd agus tha sinn gu math moiteil gur e mneTV a’ chiad chompanaidh malairteach a rinn seo. Tha sinn cuideachd moiteil às an luchd-obrach againn an seo agus thall thairis, agus a tha a-nis gu follaiseach a’ cur an taic fhèin ri leasachaidhean Gàidhlig thar gach raon anns a bheil sinn an-sàs tro na meadhanan.” Thuir Daibhidh Boag, Leasaiche Cànan Gàidhlig aig Bòrd na Gàidhlig: “Tha Bòrd na Gàidhlig a’ cur meala-naidheachd air mneTV agus iad a’ foillseachadh am Plana Gàidhlig, a’ chiad eisimpleir dhe leithid anns an roinn phribheadaich agus le an toil fhèin. Tha am Bòrd mothachail gu bheil àite air leth cudromach aig na meadhanan mar luchd-fastaidh luchd-obrach le sgilean aig àrd-ìre. Ma tha sinn a' dol a thoirt piseach air sudheachadh na Gàidhlig, tha e deatamach gum bi a' Ghàidhlig aithnichte mar sgil air a bheil luach le raon farsaing de luchd-fastaidh, agus ri cluinntinn gu h-àbhaisteach ann an ionadan-obrach air feadh na dùthcha. ## MINISTER WELCOMES FIRST TELEVISION COMPANY TO CREATE GAELIC PLAN

13 June 2011

Leading television production company mneTV, whose work ranges across coverage of SPL football matches, Magners League Rugby, Country Music, Dance, and interviews with stars in the entertainment world, has become the first organisation in the industry to produce a Gaelic Plan which has been approved by the development agency Bòrd na Gàidhlig. As a private company, mneTV is not a “public body” coming under the scope of the Gaelic Language (Scotland) Act 2005 and therefore designated as having to create a Plan. This process towards meaningful and sustainable Gaelic Planning has been taken on the company’s own initiative and was submitted to the Bòrd for approval. mneTV, which was set up in Benbecula in 1989 has its headquarters in the prestigious media quarter at Pacific Quay in Glasgow, and has a long association with Gaelic communities through its television programming. The new Gaelic Plan has been welcomed by the Minister for Skills and Learning, Alasdair Allan. “I am very pleased to see mneTV use their initiative and produce a Gaelic Language Plan, the first to come from a private company. For the company to encourage use of Gaelic internally on a daily basis, as well as producing external and online materials, is a significant step forward and very much in line with the provisions of the Gaelic Language (Scotland) Act. I hope to see more companies following their good example.” mneTV Chief Executive Allan Mac Donald said: “In a rapidly changing global media landscape we believe it is important that the Gaelic community’s aspirations and expectations are reflected within our Gaelic Language Plan. For us it was a natural extension of our work to engage formally with Bòrd na Gàidhlig, and we are very proud to be the first commercial company to do so. We’re proud also of our staff who work here in the UK and abroad, and who are publicly committing themselves to supporting Gaelic language development across the range of our activities in the media sector. ” Daibhidh Boag, Leasaiche Canain Gàidhlig (Language Development Director) at Bòrd na Gàidhlig congratulated mneTV on the publication of their Gaelic Plan: “ This is the first of its kind by the private sector and a task which mneTV undertook on a voluntary basis. The Bòrd recognises the vital role that the media plays as an employer of highly skilled Gaelic speaking staff. In order for us to grow Gaelic, it is vital that the language is recognised as a valued skill by a wide range of employers and is seen and heard as part of normal life in workplaces across the country. The mneTV Gaelic Plan provides an excellent example of what can be done and one which we hope others will follow.” As part of the Gaelic Language Plan, mneTV will encourage employees and partners to use Gaelic in daily operations, and will promote the language in its branding. The company also hopes that the

Plan will help encourage young Gaelic speakers to pursue career opportunities with mneTV and in the wider Gaelic media and broadcasting sector, and will contribute effectively to industry and wider recruitment campaigns and initiatives such as careers conventions.

*mneTV, established in 1989, is one of Scotland's leading independent television production companies with an outstanding reputation for producing high quality broadcast programming. mneTV normally employs 20-25 staff at its base in Pacific Quay in Glasgow and is the biggest single employer in Gaelic television apart from BBC.*

*The company, which has well over one hundred programme titles to its credit in single documentaries as well as long running and returning series, also supports a large number of people working in the freelance sector, such as sport commentators, camera and sound personnel and other facilities on contracts, depending on programme commitments. Some of the favourite Entertainment brands on BBC ALBA are produced by the company such as 'Ceol Country', 'Farpaisean Chon Chaorach', 'Guide ri Cathy' and 'Cocaire nan Cocairean'. Next Monday sees the launch of a new 11-part dance series by the company on BBC ALBA called 'Dannsa', a series which culminates in a one and a half hour special recorded at the Tramway Theatre in Glasgow, 'Dannsa Beò'.*

*mneTV is Scotland's most prolific Sports producer, providing Outside Broadcast programming across a number of top flight sporting genres including SPL football, Magners League Rugby, Women's Football Internationals and Shinty. mneTV now also produces live coverage of Celtic Football Club home matches for SPORTFIVE of Geneva – coverage that is sold to broadcasters worldwide and is available on multiple platforms. mneTV is the country's most widely travelled television company having worked in over 300 destinations across the world, from the slums of Quito to the glitz of Los Angeles and New York. In the last few years the company has worked in India, China, Vietnam, Guatemala, Botswana and South Africa, and has recently returned from filming country music features in Texas. Awards range from the Spirit of the Festival Award at the Celtic Film Festival to a Creative Excellence Award at the International Festival of Film and TV in California.*
