Aithisg Bhliadhnaileadh Bòrd na Gàidhlig air a foillseachadh

Chaidh an Aithisg Bhliadhnaileadh airson 2016-2017 aig Bòrd na Gàidhlig, a' phrìomh bhuidheann ann an Alba ris a bheil e an urra leasachaidhean Gàidhlig a chur air adhart, fhoillseachadh an-diugh (Diluain 30 Dàmhair) aig coinneamh de Chòmhaghail na Gàidhealtachd is nan Eilean san Òban.

Tha an aithisg a' toirt iomradh air na prìomh leasachaidhean a tha am Bòrd air a thoirt air adhart agus dhan tug e taic sa bhliadhna a dh'fhalbh. Nam measg bha: an treas Plana Càinain Nàiseanta Gàidhlig a chaidh a dhealbh; na cumhachan Gàidhlig ann an Achd an Fhoghlaim (Alba) 2016 a chaidh a chur an gnìomh; co-obrachadh le barrachd is barrachd bhuidhnean poblach a tha a' cur Phlanaichean Gàidhlig an sàs; taic don obair gus cànan, ceòl agus cultar na Gàidhlig a chur air adhart gu nàiseanta agus gu h-eadar-nàiseanta; taic do dh'fhoghlam sgoile agus nan tràth-bhliadhnaichean tron Ghàidhlig; agus taic-maoineachaidh do thidsearan gus na sgilean aca a leasachadh agus do dh'oileanaich a bha a' trèanadh airson a bhith nan tidsearan.

Chomharraich an Aithisg Bhliadhnaileadh adhartas nach beag tron bhliadhna, leithid:

- Tha 52 buidhnean poblach uile-gu-lèir ann a-nis le Planaichean Gàidhlig, a' gabhail a-steach Poileas Alba, Comhairle Baile Obar Dheathain agus Seirbheis Ambaileans na h-Alba aig a bheil Planaichean Gàidhlig a fhuair aonta am-bliadhna
- Thugadh còrr is £4.3m de thaic-maoineachaidh do 300 buidheann tro na diofar sgeamaichean maoineachaidh
- Tha 75 buidhnean 0-5 Gàidhlig gan ruith gach seachdain ann an Alba
- Barrachd cloinne ann am foghlam bun-sgoile na Gàidhlig
- Barrachd sgoilearan a' gabhail co-dhiù aon chuspair tron Ghàidhlig san àrd-sgoil

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
- 15,000 duine cloinne ag ionnsachadh Gàidhlig no tron Ghàidhlig aig diofar ìrean ann an sgoiltean air feadh Alba
- Cumhachan Gàidhlig ann an Achd an Fhoghlaim (Alba) 2016
- Stiùireadh Reachdail airson Foghlam Gàidhlig air fhoillseachadh
- Chaidh e-Sgoil a stèidheachadh sna h-Eileanan an Iar far a bheil e air soirbheachadh, agus e na amas dhaibh barrachd cothroman a thoirt air-loidhne do sgoilearan air feadh Alba air cuspairean a' churraicealaim ann an Gàidhlig
- Obair chom-pàirteach le MG ALBA gus barrachd ghoireasan a chruthachadh do luchd-ionnsachaidh tro LearnGaelic.scot agus bha còrr is 10,000 'like' a fhuair e air Facebook na chomharra air buaidh an làraich-lìn

Thuirt Cathraiche Bhòrd na Gàidhlig, Ailean Dòmhnullach, mun Aithisg Bhliadhnaile: "Tha Bòrd na Gàidhlig, ann an co-bhuinn ri Riaghaltas na h-Alba agus ar prìomh luchd-compàirt is coimhairsnachdan air feadh Alba, a' sealltainn tro iomairtean buadhdmhor is brosnachail gum bu chòir Gàidhlig a bhith air a cleachdadhbh barrachd agus gum b' fhiach gach oidhrip gus an cànan a thoirt air adhart is ìomhaigh na Gàidhlig a thogail am measg an t-sluaigh. Tha e a' sìor fhàs follaiseach dhuinn cho cudromach 's a tha a' Ghàidhlig do dh'eaconamaidh na h-Alba, agus mar a tha i na meadhan air ìrean coileanaidh nas àirde an lùib foghlaim agus air barrachd misneachd is cumhachd a thoirt do choimhairsnachdan. Chan eil rian nach bi dùblain gu leòr romhainn, ach tha cothroman ann cuideachd, agus mar Bhòrd Stiùiridh tha sinn cinnteach gun urrainn dhuinn, le bhith ag obair còmhla ri càch, faighinn thairis air na dùblain agus gun tèid againn air na cothroman a ghabhail. Tha am Bòrd Stiùiridh airson taing mhòr a thoirt dhan iomadh duine agus buidheann sna coimhairsnachdan air feadh na dùthcha a tha ag obair gus cor na Gàidhlig a dhèanamh tèarainte. Cumaidh sinn oirnn a' toirt taic dhaibh, còmhla ri ar prìomh luchd-compàirt, gus dèanamh cinnteach gun lean an t-adhartas a tha sinn air fhaicinn a thaobh cànan is cultar na Gàidhlig."

Tha mi a' dèanamh fiughair ri bhith a' faicinn nan oidhirpean gus togail air an adhartas a rinneadh agus Bòrd na Gàidhlig a' toirt an ath Phlana Càinain Nàiseanta Ghàidhlig gu buil."

Bòrd na Gàidhlig Annual Report published

The 2016-2017 Annual Report of Bòrd na Gàidhlig, the principal public body in Scotland responsible for promoting Gaelic development, has been published today (Monday 30 October) at a meeting of the Convention of the Highlands and Islands in Oban.

The report highlights the key developments undertaken by the Bòrd over the past year which have included the development of the third National Gaelic Language Plan; the Gaelic provisions of the Education (Scotland) Act 2016 being implemented; collaboration with a growing number of public bodies on the production and implementation of Gaelic Language Plans; support for the promotion of Gaelic language, music and culture nationally and internationally; support for early years and Gaelic medium education; the provision of funding for professional development for teachers and for students undertaking teacher training.

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Key outcomes highlighted in the Annual Report include:

- 52 public bodies with Gaelic Language Plans including Police Scotland, Aberdeen City Council and The Scottish Ambulance Service among those to have had their Gaelic Plans approved this year
- Over £4.3m financial support provided to 300 organisations through various funding streams
- 75 0-5 years Gaelic groups running each week in Scotland
- Increased numbers of children in Gaelic medium primary education
- Growth in the number of pupils taking at least one subject in Gaelic in secondary school
- 15,000 children engaging with Gaelic at various levels in schools throughout Scotland
- Gaelic provisions within the Education (Scotland) Act 2016
- Publication of new Statutory Guidance on Gaelic Education
- The successful introduction of e-Sgoil in the Western Isles which aims to provide greater online access to curriculum subjects in Gaelic to students throughout Scotland
- Partnership working with MG ALBA on the development of more resources for learners through LearnGaelic.scot and its continued success with over 10,000 likes on Facebook

Commenting on the Annual Report Allan MacDonald, Chairman of Bòrd na Gàidhlig said “Bòrd na Gàidhlig, working together with the Scottish Government and key partners and communities throughout Scotland, continues to present a strong and positive case for the increased use of the Gaelic language and culture, its development and its promotion. We increasingly recognise the importance of Gaelic to the Scottish economy, to the levels of attainment in education and to increasing community confidence and empowerment. While there are undoubtedly some major challenges to be faced, there are also opportunities and as a Board we are confident that, by working together, these challenges can be met and the opportunities taken. The Board wishes to place on record its thanks to the many people and organisations in communities all over the country who work towards a sustainable future for Gaelic. We will continue to support them, in conjunction with key partners, so that the Gaelic language and culture continues to make progress.”

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Deputy First Minister John Swinney said: “I welcome Bòrd na Gàidhlig’s Annual Report, which highlights a number of key initiatives it has supported over the past year. In particular it is encouraging to see increasing numbers of children in Gaelic education and solutions being provided to address gaps and support existing provision, such as the e-Sgoil. I look forward to seeing this success built upon as Bòrd na Gàidhlig develops the next National Gaelic Language Plan.”

Allan MacDonald continued “Launching Bòrd na Gàidhlig’s annual report in Oban at the Convention of the Highlands and Islands is particularly appropriate for a number of reasons - Argyll has been the cradle of Gaelic language and culture; economically because of the opportunities that Gaelic offers for economic growth; and educationally as parents in Oban have been calling for a Gaelic school and Argyll and Bute Council has supported them through funding for a feasibility study from their innovative participatory budgeting funding.”
