

<p style="text-align: center;">Seirbheis Cùraim Nàiseanta do dh’Alba Freagairt le Bòrd na Gàidhlig 02 Samhain 2021</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">A National Care Service for Scotland Response by Bòrd na Gàidhlig 02 November 2021</p>
<p>Is e Bòrd na Gàidhlig a’ phrìomh bhuidheann ann an Alba air a bheil dleastanas gus leasachadh Gàidhlig a chur air adhart agus gus comhairle a thoirt do Mhinistearan na h-Alba mu chùisean Gàidhlig.</p> <p>Bu chòir mar a tha Riaghaltas na h-Alba a' dealbhadh Seirbheis Cùraim Nàiseanta do dh’Alba a bhith a' nochdadh nam poileasaidhean is geallaidhean aca a thaobh na Gàidhlig.</p> <p>Tha Riaghaltas na h-Alba “ag aithneachadh gu bheil a’ Ghàidhlig na pàirt bhunasach de dhualchas, dearbh-aithne nàiseanta agus beatha chultarail na h-Alba”¹. Tha e “fhathast dealasach a thaobh a bhith a’ toirt taic don Ghàidhlig agus ag amas air dèanamh cinnteach gu bheil an fheadhainn a tha airson Gàidhlig a chleachdadh nam beatha làitheil a’ faighinn cothrom sin a dhèanamh”². Tha seo a’ toirt a-steach dealas airson “dèanamh cinnteach gu bheil luchd-labhairt na Gàidhlig ann an coimhearsnachdan eileanach air am brosnachadh agus a’ faighinn taic gus an riochdachadh fhèin tro mheadhan na Gàidhlig”³.</p> <p>’S e prìomh amas a’ Phlana Cànain Nàiseanta Ghàidhlig 2018-2023⁴ (PCNG) gum bi a’ Ghàidhlig ga cleachdadh nas trice, le barrachd dhaoine agus ann an raon nas fharsainge de shuidheachaidhean. Tha e a’ dol air adhart gu bhith ag aithris gu bheil “cùisean eile a’ toirt buaidh air a’ chuimse seo”. Tha iad sin a’ gabhail a-steach cùisean eaconamach</p>	<p>Bòrd na Gàidhlig is the principal public body in Scotland responsible for promoting Gaelic development and providing advice to the Scottish Ministers on Gaelic issues.</p> <p>The Scottish Government’s design of a National Care Service should reflect its existing policies and commitments regarding the Gaelic language.</p> <p>The Scottish Government “recognises that Gaelic is an integral part of Scotland’s heritage, national identity and current cultural life”⁵. It “remains committed to supporting the Gaelic language and aims to ensure that the those who wish to live their lives through the language are afforded the opportunities to do so”⁶. That includes a commitment to “ensure that Gaelic speakers in island communities are encouraged and supported to represent themselves through the medium of Gaelic”⁷.</p> <p>The National Gaelic Language Plan 2018-2023⁸ has the overall aim that Gaelic “is used more often, by more people and in a wider range of situations”. It goes on to state that “other issues impact on this aim”. These include economic and infrastructural issues. The Plan notes the need to</p>

"ensure their impact on Gaelic is recognised and addressed".

The development of a National Care Service therefore needs to ensure that it provides a service for Gaelic speakers of any age through appropriate staffing, visibility and use of the language in locations which are appropriate and accessible to families.
